Program Highlights



- More than \$2.4B worth of DPW / SWB work in the next 8 years
 - Most comprehensive infrastructure program our region has seen in a generation.
 - More than 200 individual projects every neighborhood will feel a positive impact.
 - Multiple Funding Sources: FEMA-funded road / waterline work, FEMA-funded Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) projects, HUD-funded National Disaster Resiliency Competition (NDRC) grant projects, SWB-funded Sewer System Evaluation and Rehabilitation Program (SSERP) (sewer consent decree) work and City-funded bond project work.
 - Aggressive project schedules coordinated to minimize construction-related impacts.
 - On average, one construction bid opening per week beginning in 2017 thru 2020.
 - Work will create **thousands** of construction jobs across the city and <u>maximize</u> economic opportunity for the City's small and disadvantaged businesses.





Program Highlights



- Will address long overdue repairs and make infrastructure improvements to roads, drainage, water, and sewer systems
 - Will take a comprehensive and programmatic approach to the work.
 - Will leverage and link multiple funding sources with the results from the *Citywide Pavement Assessment* to improve drainage system capacity and resilience using green infrastructure.
 - Will meet all sewer system consent decree milestones.











Citywide Construction by Year








































Project Limits Lakeview North Group A









Project Limits Lakeview North Group A



- ✓ Design completed by Richard C. Lambert Consultants
- ✓ Construction contractor is Hard Rock Construction
- ✓ Approximately \$2.8M project
- ✓ Part of the \$2.4B Capital Improvement Program
- ✓ Construction will begin at the beginning of May 2017 and last through winter 2018.

- ✓ Patching with asphalt and concrete
- ✓ Repairing damaged curbs, sidewalks and driveway aprons
- ✓ Installing American with Disabilities Act-compliant curb ramps at intersections

Americans with Disabilities Act-Compliant Curb Ramps





Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-compliant curb ramps at sidewalk corners ensure accessibility for people who are visually or physically impaired, using wheelchairs or strollers.

Construction Phases and Details



Phasing/Sequencing

- Work will take place in the eastern portion of the project (bounded by Robert E. Lee, Orleans, Harrison, and Canal) during the first four months
- Work will take place in the western portion of the project (bounded by Robert E Lee, Canal, Harrison, and West End) during the last four months

Traffic

- Only one lane will be closed at a time
- In the event of full block closures, 48-hour notice will be given to residents
- There will not be a full closure of successive blocks

Staging

Construction equipment will not be staged in areas that prohibit residential access and parking

What to Expect During Construction



Temporary construction impacts

- Additional construction equipment
- Limited parking availability
- Sounds
- Dust

Efforts to minimize construction impacts

- ✓ Construction signage placed around the sites.
- ✓ Any temporary closures will be communicated in advance.
- ✓ Any changes to garbage and US Postal services will be communicated in advance.
- ✓ Residents will be informed throughout construction.


Regular work hours are Monday-Friday 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Permission for occasional weekend work may be granted, if required.
