SWBNO / DPW Joint Infrastructure Program Accomplishments

- December 2015: \$2B FEMA Settlement for Hurricane Katrina-related damage to roads and subsurface infrastructure
- May 7, 2018: 10 JIRR projects in construction
- Since May 7, 2018
 - √ 72 projects totaling \$709M have gone into construction
 - ✓ 105 projects have gone into final design, totaling \$884M
- Current Status with estimated values
 - ✓ JIRR Program Spending accelerated, approximately 17% (\$200M) of \$1.4B Obligation Reimbursed)
 - ✓ Construction: 58 Projects, \$492M
 - ✓ Bid & Award: 33 Projects, \$234M
 - ✓ Final Design: 47 Projects, \$527M
 - ✓ Completed: 30 projects, \$132M

Types of Capital Improvements Projects Construction

Full-Depth Reconstruction

Repair sewerage, water, and drainage lines, rebuild the street entirely, and repair sidewalks and curbs.

Patch Mill/Overlay

Repave the asphalt roadway from curb to curb and repair damaged sidewalks.

Patch Concrete

Remove damaged portions of the concrete roadway and replace it with new smooth concrete pavement and repair damaged sidewalks.

Types of Capital Improvements Projects Construction

Incidental Road Repairs

Remove damaged portions of the asphalt roadway and replace it with new smooth pavement.


Non-Paving Incidentals

Repair damaged sidewalks, driveway aprons and curbs within the public right-of-way.

Other Group Project

Street is in the design phase or is planned to be built in a future project.





Project Overview:

Martin Luther King Blvd (St. Charles - S. Claiborne)

- Design: HNTB Corporation
- Construction: Boh Brothers Construction Company, LLC
- Construction Cost: Approximately \$4.8M
- Funding Source: Federal Highways Administration Surface Transportation Program; City Bond Program
- Timeline: Project will begin May of 2022 and be completed in Summer of 2023



Scope of work

- Replacement of roadways;
- Repave the roadway;
- Replacement of some sidewalks and driveway aprons;
- Install Americans with Disabilities Act-compliant curb ramps at intersection; and
- Install protected bicycle lanes


Waterline Replacements or Repairs

- There will be limited waterline work and service disruptions.
- Notifications will be sent to residents 48-hours prior to full waterline closures and 24-hours notice will be given for waterline test closures (per Louisiana Department of Health guidelines).
- If a lead service line on City of New Orleans right-of-way is exposed and subsequently replaced, it could cause problems such as leaks on your property. When this occurs Sewerage & Water Board of New Orleans provides information to help guide your private plumber to repair pipes on private property.






Patch Mill / Overlay

Patch Concrete


- Replacing one or multiple damaged concrete panels in the roadway
- Repairs may be made to some damaged curbs, sidewalks and driveway aprons





Sidewalks

- Sidewalk panels
 adjacent to Americans
 with Disabilities Act
 (ADA)-compliant
 ramps will be replaced
 with new sidewalks.
- New sidewalks and ramps will meet ADAregulations.






Americans with Disabilities Act-Compliant Curb Ramps



Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-compliant curb ramps at sidewalk corners ensure accessibility for people who are visually or physically impaired, using wheelchairs or strollers.

Protected Bicycle Lanes



This project seeks to balance the needs of all roadway users, consistent with the City's Complete Streets Policy. Improvements include repaving the roadway, adding protected bike lanes, improving access to bus stops, installing marked crosswalks, and improving intersection geometry and sight distances at driveways.

Two general travel lanes will be retained in both directions in the vicinity of S. Claiborne Ave. Onstreet parking remains on the uptown side only.








Martin Luther King, Jr Blvd (Clara to Robertson)

The roadway will be reconfigured as a protected bike lane, parking lane, and general travel lane between Clara St. and S. Robertson. for lakebound traffic. Two travel lanes and a parking lane are planned in the riverbound direction in this section.




Note: Two travel lanes in each direction resume at Simon Bolivar Ave intersection only (no parking) The roadway will be reconfigured as a protected bike lane, parking lane, and general travel lane between S. Robertson and Oretha Castle Haley in both travel directions.

What to Expect During Construction

A sequencing schedule will be made available to the community within 2-weeks of this work starting.

Temporary construction impacts

- Additional construction equipment
- Limited parking availability
- Sounds
- Dust
- Intermittent roadway closures

Efforts to minimize construction impacts

- ✓ Construction signage placed around the sites.
- ✓ Any temporary closures will be communicated in advance.
- Construction equipment will not be staged in areas that prohibit residential access and parking.
- ✓ If you notice any changes to your garbage and/or recycling, and US Postal services please contact our office.
- Residents will be informed throughout construction.

Regular work hours are Monday-Friday 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Permission for occasional weekend work may be granted, if required.





Project Overlap and Coordination

The Martin Luther King (St. Charles – S. Claiborne) project will have overlap with other ongoing construction projects Central City Group A and Central City Group B. Road closures and other disruptions related to construction will occur – project teams for these projects and Martin Luther King (St. Charles – S. Claiborne) are coordinating their schedules and construction phasing in order to minimize impact.

 - S. Liberty St and Martin Luther King Jr Blvd
- Central City B:
 - S. Saratoga St and Martin Luther King Jr Blvd
 - Robert C. Blakes Sr Dr / Carondelet St and Martin Luther King Jr Blvd
 - Prytania St and Martin Luther King Jr Blvd




Mardi Gras and Parades Impacts


- There will be access impacts to and from the primary uptown parade route during construction. We will try to minimize impact where possible.
 - Construction is adjacent and will not cross active parade routes. Primary impact will be related to parking.
- The project team will work with Community Outreach and Neighborhood Engagement partners to minimize impact and address overlap with any future events and parades.
