Capital Improvement Program Highlights

- **More than \$2.2B worth of DPW / SWB work in the next 8 years**
- Most comprehensive infrastructure program our region has seen in a generation.
- More than **200** individual projects - every neighborhood will feel a positive impact.
- **Multiple Funding Sources:** FEMA-funded road / waterline work, FEMA-funded Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) projects, HUD-funded National Disaster Resiliency Competition (NDRC) grant projects, SWB-funded Sewer System Evaluation and Rehabilitation Program (SSERP) (sewer consent decree) work and City-funded bond project work.
- Work will create **thousands** of construction jobs across the city and maximize economic opportunity for the City's small and disadvantaged businesses.



Filmore North Group A - Overview

- **Designer:** Professional Engineering Consultants (PEC) Corporation
- **Construction Contractor:** Command Construction Industries, LLC
- **Cost:** Approximately \$5.5M
- **Schedule:** Construction will begin early Feb. 2019 and last for approximately one year

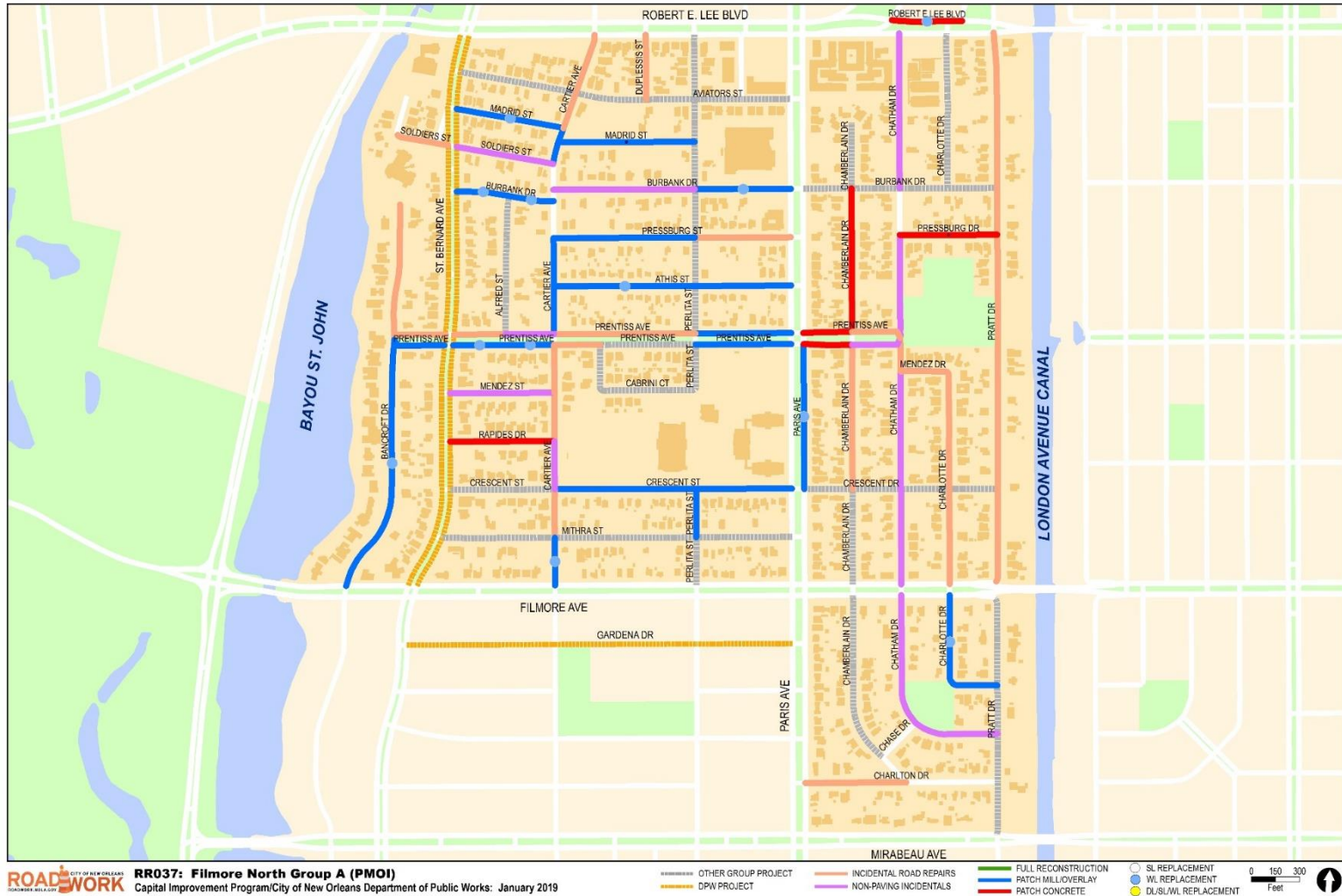


Scope of Work

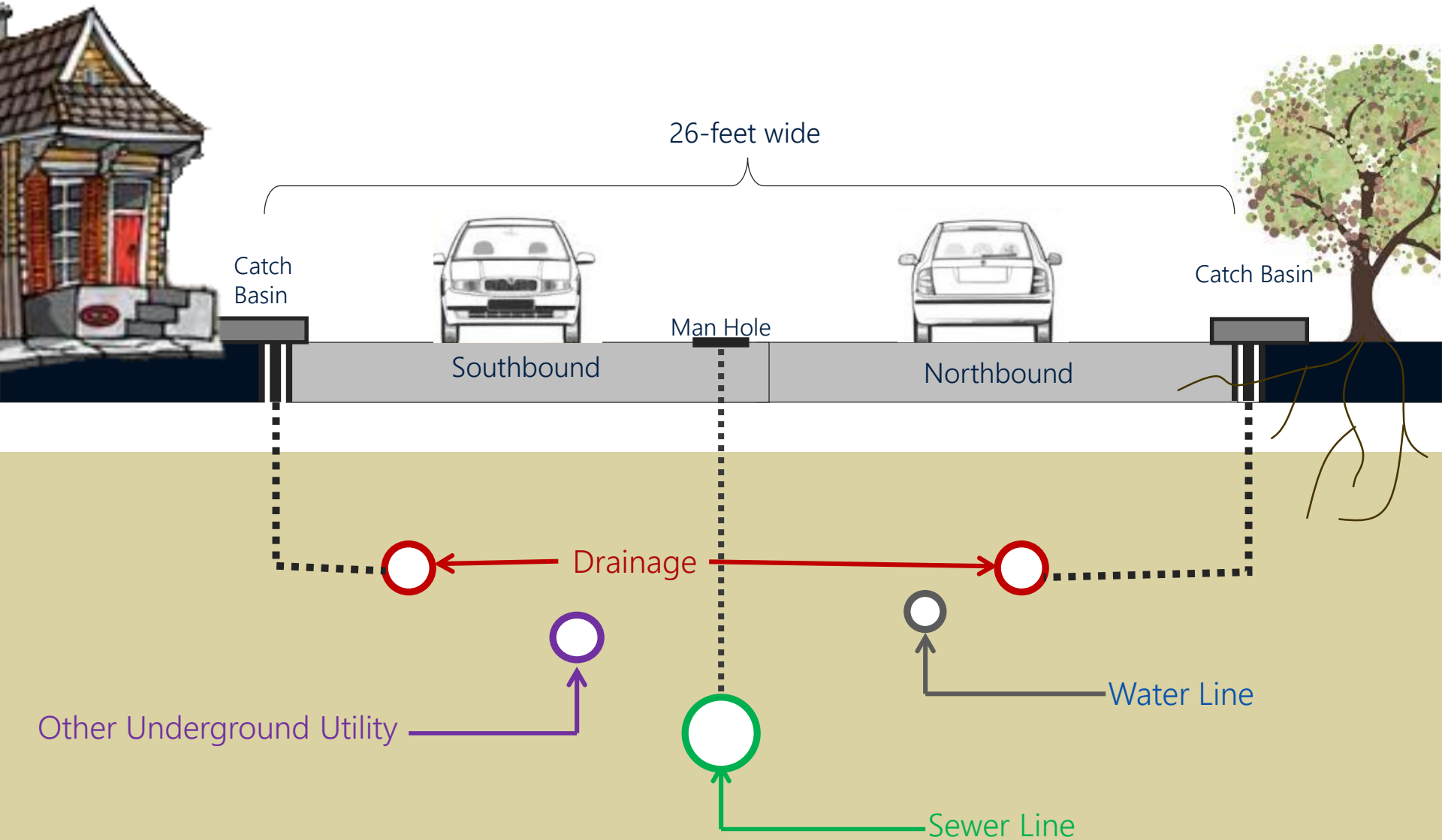
- Repaving the asphalt roadway from curb-to-curb in some areas;
- Patching the roadway with asphalt in some areas;
- Repairing some damaged sidewalks and driveway aprons;
- Installing Americans with Disabilities Act-compliant curb ramp at intersections; and
- Replacing/repairing damaged underground water, sewer and/or drainage lines.

Waterline Replacements or Repairs

- Drainage line repairs
- Minimal water service disruptions
- Notifications will be sent to residents 48-hours prior to any work that may cause water services disruptions



Waterline Replacements or Repairs

- This project will begin with the replacement of the waterlines on the following streets: Madrid, Burbank, Athis, Prentiss, Paris, Charlotte, Bancroft, and Pressburg.
- Full road closures will occur on Charlotte and Bancroft Drives for full restoration.
- Once the utility work is complete the trench sites will be filled. Paving work will follow.



Patch Mill / Overlay



- Roadway will be re-surfaced with asphalt
- Repairs may be made to some damaged curbs, sidewalks and driveway aprons



Patch Concrete

- Replacing one or multiple damaged concrete panels in the roadway
- Repairs may be made to some damaged curbs, sidewalks and driveway aprons



Incidental Road Repairs



- Roadway patches will be re-surfaced with asphalt
- Repairs may be made to some damaged curbs, sidewalks and driveway aprons



Non-Paving Incidentals



- Eligible damaged or missing sidewalks will be removed and replaced
- New sidewalks meet Americans with Disabilities Act requirements



Americans with Disabilities Act-Compliant Curb Ramps

Curb ramps at sidewalk corners ensure accessibility for people who are visually or physically impaired, using wheelchairs or strollers.

What to Expect During Construction Traffic

- One travel lane will be maintained, in each direction, throughout construction on water line replacement streets
- Full road closures are necessary on Charlotte and Bancroft drives during water line replacement work.
- Limited parking available near trench site.
- Crews will attempt to allow local access to driveways in the evenings, depending on the location of the water line replacement.



What to Expect During Construction

Temporary construction impacts

- Additional construction equipment
- Limited parking availability
- Sounds
- Dust



Efforts to minimize construction impacts

- Construction signage placed around the sites.
- Any temporary closures will be communicated in advance.
- Any changes to garbage and US Postal services will be communicated in advance.
- Residents will be informed throughout construction.

*Regular work hours are Monday-Friday 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
Permission for occasional weekend work may be granted, if required.*
